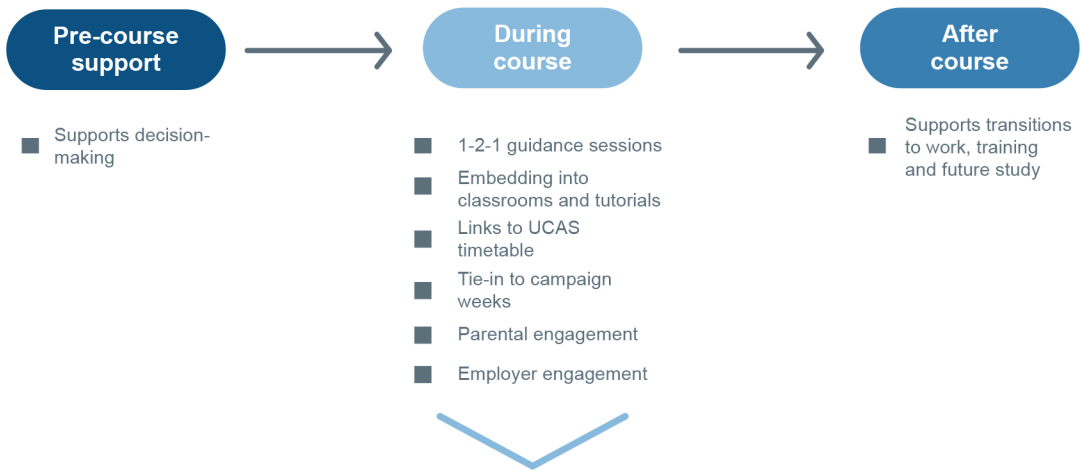

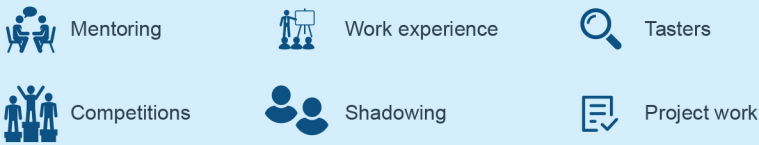

## CAREERS PROVISION IS OFTEN ORGANISED CHRONOLOGICALLY



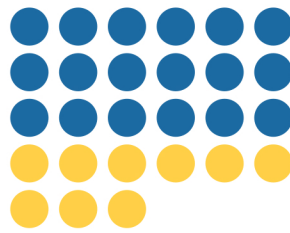
## EMPLOYER ENGAGEMENT IS INCREASINGLY IMPORTANT
